



Family Health Planning Frequently Asked Questions:

- Does Family Planning take regular medical insurance or AHCCCS? *Yes and No, Family Planning is solely for people who have no form of medical insurance. However if the medical insurance you have does not cover Birth Control and Family Planning Services, we will be able to accept you as a patient.*
- What if I have my tubes tied? Can I still get services from Family Planning? *No, Family Planning is a birth control clinic and its clientele are people who are still within childbearing age and have not had a Tubal Ligation. If your tubes are tied, you can call Well Woman Healthcheck at (520)628-3591 and they can help you with services.*
- I am a male and wanted to get checked for Sexually Transmitted Infections, can I do this here? *As long as you are not having symptoms, such as discharge or burning, we can see you and give you a general STI urine based test for gonorrhea and Chlamydia. If you require more extensive testing you can call the Pima County STD Clinic at (520)624-8272*
- Do you give prescriptions for other Birth Control that you do not carry in clinic? *No. We can only give you the birth control that we carry in stock.*
- My friend told me that your services are free, is that true? *No, all services are based on a sliding fee scale, which means that we use your household income to determine how much of your bill you will be responsible for. There are times when, because of your income, you may not be responsible for any part of your bill, but will be asked to give a donation if it is possible.*
- Do you do HIV testing? *No, Family Planning no longer offers HIV testing. You can call the Pima County HIV Clinic at (520)791-7676.*
- I'm 17 years old, do my parents have to know I come to Family Planning? *No, our services are 100% confidential. Your parents do not have to know that you come to the clinic. However, we do encourage parental involvement if at all possible.*
