New requirements for Licenses and Food Operators Certificates

In order to comply with HB2102, Pima County Health Department will begin requiring individuals requesting a License or Food Certification to provide proof of lawful presence in the United States. The new law establishes that any of the following documents would need to be presented:

- An Arizona driver license issued after 1996 or an Arizona non-operating identification license
- A driver license issued by a state that verifies lawful presence in the United States
- A birth certificate or delayed birth certificate issued in any state, territory or possession of the United States
- A U.S. certificate of birth abroad
- A U.S. passport
- A foreign passport with a U.S. visa
- An I-94 form with a photograph
- A U.S. citizenship and immigration services employment authorization document or refugee travel document
- A U.S. certificate of citizenship
- A tribal certificate of Indian blood
- A tribal or bureau of Indian affairs affidavit of birth

This means that if a customer is unable to provide proof of lawful presence we will not provide them with a license or food certificate.
