## What is a Child Care Health Consultant (CCHC)?

A Child Care Health Consultant is a professional who has knowledge about the health and safety of children and about early childhood settings. The CCHC is specially trained to work directly with child care providers in family care homes, centers, and other group care settings.

### Who can be a CCHC?

In Arizona, nurses provide leadership to the Child Care Health Consultation System. In addition, other health professionals and specialists may be a part of a “child care consultation team.”

### What does a CCHC do?

The role of the Child Care Health Consultant is to deliver information, conduct training, and provide other direct or referral services related to health and safety. CCHCs provide services over the telephone, by visiting child care programs, and through training child care staff or parents.
